As they come together, they receive lots of different insights. Our homes can become like a temple. If we make studying the gospel #1, everything else will fall into place.

Her husband goes back and forth between being active and then inactive in the Church. She is currently on her own in studying the new curriculum. She asked her children what made them stay on the right path and they answered that they always did everything together as a family and were taught Gospel principles. Her husband's traits of service, honesty and integrity passed on to their children. She shared several of the good things their children are doing who were raised by both her and her husband. It is important that we all try to implement the program and not be overwhelmed. We will find out what works and what doesn't.
